

# Antigua & Barbuda

#### Required Documents:

- Original Bill of Lading/Air Way Bill
- Freight sheet
- Detailed packing list
- Detailed inventory of all household goods and personal effects
- Detailed commercial invoice
- Invoice duly signed and witnessed

*Note:* Shipper *must* confirm with the consulate to make sure the goods in the shipment can be imported. Shipper will be assessed a Duty and Tax Rate of 60.25% of the estimated CIF.

## Importing Motor Vehicles

- Vehicles exceeding the size limits below are not allowed:
  - Length: 17 ft. 81/2 in.
  - Width: 6 ft. 7 in.
  - Height: 13 ft. 6 in.
- Customs Valuation Officers will appraise used vehicles.
- Shipper must present the Certificate of Title, Commercial Invoice for new vehicles, Original ECCM Commercial Invoice (signed), and an import license.
- Duty rates on autos: 01-1999cc: 87.5% of CIF value; 2000cc: up to 107.5% of CIF value

## Prohibited/Restricted Items

- Firearms and ammunition
- Illegal drugs
- Some goods (i.e. food, alcohol, cigarettes, clothes, etc.) require an import license when imported from any country who is not a member of the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States (OCES).
