

# IMPORTING HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

## DUTY-FREE ENTRY IS PERMITTED IF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET:

 Items have been used abroad for at least six months

# Note:

All new articles, household utensils, electric appliances, machines, foodstuffs, gifts and souvenirs are subject to duties

## **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

- Copy of passport
- Non-valued inventory or packing list with shipper's signature
- Certificate of Registration in Luxembourg Commune of Residence
- Proof of residence outside of EU for 12 months

#### Notes:

- Diplomats must provide Customs Form 136F and Diplomatic Statement
- Returning Belgian residents must provide a Certificate of Change of Residence from the last Belgium Commune of residence

#### **IMPORTATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES**

 Must be included on inventory list with complete chassis and engine numbers

## **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

- Copy of passport
- Title or certificate of ownership
- Valid insurance documents
- Copy of purchase invoice
- Complete contact information of shipper

## **IMPORTING PETS**

- Requirements vary for cats and dogs.
- Must present a valid rabies certificate and any applicable health certificates (provided by home veterinarian)
