

Importing Personal Property Into CONGO (DEMOCRATIC)

IMPORTING HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- ✓ Packing list
- Copy of valid passport (including pages showing the entry permit)
- Original Bill of Lading (no express release accepted (AWB)
- Detailed inventory in French dated, valued and signed by the shipper
- Resident or working permit or letter from the employer explaining that the client is starting a new contract in Democratic Republic of Congo
- Certificate for definitive settlement (for returning citizens only).

Notes:

- All original documents should reach the destination agent a minimum of 14 days before shipment's arrival to allow the shipper's employer to obtain the certificate for free entry from the Customs Head Office and minimize port charges.
- Diplomats will not be charged taxes on Household Goods
- Private shippers (non-diplomats) will pay a tax of 56% of the CIF value

IMPORTING MOTOR VEHICLES:

- All documents should reach the destination agent at least one month prior to vehicle's arrival to avoid any delay and demurrage and storage charges.
- Chassis number and weight of vehicle must be stated on the OBL

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- ✓ Original registration card
- ✓ OBL/AWB
- ✓ Car Invoice
- ✓ Non sale Certificate

RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED ITEMS:

- Firearms and ammunition (submitted to authorization from territorial administration)
- Alcohol (must be accompanied with the mention of "fond de cave" to be acceptable and duty free)
- Unlawful Drugs
