

Importing Personal Property into

Tunisia

Required Documents:

- Legalized Residence Permit
- Work Permit
- Customs Permit
- Bank Guarantee (required if Residence Permit and Work Permit are not available)
- Proof of employment
- Certificate of Residence Change
- Letter from shipper authorizing the Destination Agent to clear shipment
- Detailed in French, showing all appliances, video, stereo and electronics equipment. Must list make and model

Notes:

Shipper MUST be present at the time of customs clearance. All shipments will be inspected. Only one shipment is allowed and it must arrive within three months of the shipper. Second shipments are allowed if it arrives within six months of the Residence Permit.

Videotapes will be viewed by customs. Shipper will likely have to pay a few for this service.

Prohibited/Restricted Items

- Weapons and ammunition
- Drugs
- Pornographic material
- Alcohol and tobacco products
- Tunisian currency
- Books, Telephones and Fax machines require a special permit

Notes:

New items are restricted and subject to duties.

Only one of each type of appliance is allowed.
